MATH

We read "Teddy Bears Count to Ten" and "Where's the Bear?". We used position words to describe where bear was. We made a class book showing where our bear was hiding. We sent home the mini book "Teddy Bears Count to Ten". Please read it with your child. Point out and read the number sentences: 3 + 1 = 4. Also listen for rhyming words: door, four. We have been making teddy bears. We made bear headbands and bear date markers for our classroom calendar. We also made hearts for our calendar.

JESUS TIME





Child Development Day 2 through 4-Year-Old Developmental Screenings

Children between the ages of 2 and 4 who are not enrolled in 4-year-old kindergarten or 5-year-old kindergarten, and who live in the Berlin Area School District, are eligible for a developmental screening.



What is a Developmental Screening?

The screening is a snapshot of your child's overall development. The developmental screening is designed to inform families about typical child growth and development and expand awareness of available community resources for children ages two to four. The screening also helps identify children in need of further assessment.

Who needs to be screened?

The Berlin Area School District recommends that ALL children participate in a developmental screening. Children can be screened on or after their 2nd birthday. If your child is enrolled in 4-year-old kindergarten, please consult with your child's teacher with concerns, it is not necessary for a child enrolled in 4-year-old kindergarten to attend Child Development Day.

What you can expect

- Trained literacy staff modeling what reading with your child can look like
- Information about community resources and opportunities for your child.
- Contact with 4K teachers

- Vision and hearing screening
- Individual screening with your child, conducted by a trained district staff member
- Individual conferences about the developmental progress of your child.
