He had some exposure to the Bible at a Christian school in his home country, but it wasn't until 2007 that he truly began to explore the Christian faith. Through a food bank at a local church in Milwaukee, Ebou began to connect with the Christians, and several pastors, including Rev. Dr. Gary Rohwer of POBLO, helped him to understand the differences spoken about Christ in the Quran and the Bible. Through this process, he confessed his faith in Christ as his only true Lord and Savior. Ebou now serves as a POBLO missionary in Milwaukee, sharing the Gospel with others. He primarily interacts with African Muslim immigrants, including those from Somalia, Kenya, and Sudan.
