We have sent home a review paper for the letter V. Please help your child complete it and return it to school. Your child will be able to share it with their classmates.

This week we were reviewing how to write the numbers 5, 6 and 7. Our poem this week was "Hot Cross Buns".

We continue to learn songs for sight words. We added the words am and have.

We sent home the grant book, "Ducks in a Row". As you read it with your child, have them point out all the words they can read.

We read a story called, "How Many Toys in the Tub". We used math sentences using addition and subtraction to illustrate what was happening in the story as we read. We compared items and made predictions about which would float, and which would sink.

With the new month we made new calendar markers. This month we made three different kinds of bath toys, duck, turtle, and boat. We used unifix cubes to practice an ABC pattern.

During Jesus' time, we read about Jesus ascending to Heaven. Jesus went up into heaven, above the clouds. Before leaving, He gave His disciples a job to do: tell everyone about Him. Jesus wants us to show and tell people about His great love for them. He promises to stay with us always and to take us to heaven to live with Him forever.

We cannot wait for our moms to open their presents on Sunday. We have also started working on our graduation projects - we need those family pictures please.

We are in the final countdown for the chicken eggs to hatch. We are excited to see them hatching Monday and Tuesday.

We are working through our last Superkid book, and we have finished all our math lessons. Please keep reading with your child 20 to 30 minutes every day. They got a new Superkid story today and their next homework bag. Can you believe there are only 15 days of school left? Kindergarten graduation is fast approaching: May 26th at 6pm. Please send in a family photo that we can use for our graduation project.

This week we heard from Acts 1:1 -11, the story of how Jesus arose into heaven! The disciples were told that Jesus will come back the same way He left! He goes to prepare a place for ALL of us in heaven, so we can be with Him. He also told the disciples to stay in Jerusalem and wait for the Holy Spirit to come to them. Well, how long would they have to wait? 10 more days, the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came like the sound of a rushing wind. Their gift was to speak in different languages and tell everyone in Jerusalem about Jesus! We also heard about the man named Saul. Kids in the kitchen

Cooking with your youngster will teach him valuable kitchen skills—and help him practice reading and math. Try these suggestions.

Read recipes. Ask your child to read a recipe aloud. Then, have him gather the ingredients and tools you'll need. Can he find dried oregano and a whisk? Next, follow the steps together. *Idea*: Build his vocabulary by explaining unfamiliar cooking words. ("Zest means to scrape off tiny bits of the lemon peel.")



Use math. Put your youngster in charge of kitchen math. He can find the correct measuring spoons and cups, measure wet and dry ingredients, and read a food thermometer. He'll also learn about conversions—for example, that 4 tbsp. = ½ cup.

Tip: Get your child in the habit of putting dishes in the dishwasher as he works. That way, there won't be a big sticky mess to clean up at the end. ▶


