Happy September to you all. It is time for school to begin. We welcome Mrs. Anna Cargin to our school staff. She is taking over our 3rd and 4th grade class after the retirement of Mrs. Candy Schram who served our children for many years. Mrs. Cargin is married to Alexander, who is a DCE (director of Christian education) at Faith Lutheran Church in Fond du Lac. She is being installed on Sunday, August 29, during the 9am church service. We look forward to working with her for years to come.

The school is having our annual Kick-off cook out on Sunday, August 29, after church. Congregation members are welcomed to drop over to have a brat or burger and check out the school as we get set for another great academic year. We will be around for tours until early afternoon. Did You Know...



Sharon Stumpner's life got off to a pretty rocky start when she began struggling to breathe and turned blue shortly after birth. The day was March 12th 1952, at Berlin Memorial Hospital, and this new baby was immediately put into an incubator. Within a few hours, she was breathing on her own and the first crises of her young life was over. A second crisis nearly happened the day she was dismissed from the hospital. Sharon almost wound up with the wrong family she and another baby were when accidentally switched. Luckily, the other child was a boy; the problem was discovered and immediately corrected.

Her parents, Russell and Winnie Stumpner belonged to Emmaus Lutheran Church in Poy Sippi and there Sharon was baptized. At home, she had an older brother Larry; and soon, 2 more children, Dennis and Cindy followed. Her parents divorced after Cindy was born and some-time later Winnie married Ralph Mattice. The family moved to Red Granite and grew as Lois, Ron (Butch), Don (Hank), Marlene (died at 3 months) and Eugene completed the family.

"I have a very vivid memory of crawling up on my mom's lap and seeing a little baby girl with red hair all wrapped up in a green blanket. I was about 5 years old and thrilled when Mom let me hold my new little sister, Lois. Today we are best friends and spend lots of quality time together."

Sharon began her school years at Red Granite Grade school and was Confirmed at the 1st Congregational Church there. She struggled in school and it was soon discovered that she couldn't see the

blackboard so glasses were prescribed. Turns out being in the incubator had affected Sharon's eyes and she needed a lot more than glasses. Through the years she has had a cornea transplant, several laser treatments, cataracts removed and needs special glasses for driving. She is quite lucky that she didn't lose her sight completely.

Sharon is a good worker. Her first job was babysitting for a whopping 30 cents an hour. During her Sophomore year at Wautoma High School, she decided to quit school and get a job. She found work at Safeguard America where her starting pay was \$1.65 an hour. She worked there for 21 years. Sharon also studied and earned her GED high school equivalency diploma. Something she is very proud of.

In 1993 she began working at Ripon Athletic. Sharon always loved to sew and now found work doing what she loved. "Many people think we only make athletic uniforms but we also make lots of other things; duffle bags, muffs, sweat shirts & sweat pants, basketball jerseys and BHS letter jackets are just a few of the other items made here in Berlin. If your letter jacket needs new cuffs or a patch sewn on, bring it in and we'll fix it right up for vou." Sharon helped make all the old Packer uniforms now on display at Lambeau Field. "The old uniforms were made of very thick wool material that was woven similar to a burlap bag. It was very hard to work with as it tended to curl up as you sewed. The materials we use today are very high-tech and easy to work with. Some people think Ripon Athletic only makes Packer uniforms but they make uniforms for 20 different NFL and AFL teams including the Bears, Lions and Cowboys." Sharon has met a lot of Packer

players through the years. This year Ripon Athletic is celebrating its 100th Anniversary. "I love my job. Working at Ripon Athletic is fun.

When she's not working, Sharon enjoys listening to music; Willy Nelson, Fats Domino and any kind of rock n roll are favorites. Chicago PD and Dr. Pol top her list for TV viewing and you may see her enjoying dinner at Jeffs or Silvercryst. Sharon also loves being by water, pontoon boat rides, everything about Door County and has taken a whale watching ocean trip on the Atlantic. "Unfortunately, the whales did not cooperate that day but the trip was still fun!!"

At St John, Sharon is a past member of the LWML and is always happy when asked to bring a dish-to-pass". "My favorite thing about St John is the warmth of all the wonderful people who are part of this congregation." God Bless you Sharon!




