The story of Christmas focuses on the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem. This is no ordinary child, however. Matthew 1 sheds much light on the identity of this baby through the names and titles He is given in the first chapter of the New Testament.

Jesus is the Christ (Matthew 1:1,16-18):
The word "Christ" comes from the Hebrew word for "Messiah", which literally means "the anointed one". In the Old Testament, this is a reference to the promised King of Israel who would come to establish God's kingdom on earth and reign over all nations. Matthew wants us to know that this Jesus is the long awaited Messiah. The king has arrived! The Messiah is born! This is reason to celebrate with much joy and thanksgiving, and this is why Christians around the world love to sing about the birth of King Jesus.

Jesus is the Son of David (Matthew 1:1,17): "Son of David" was a well-known messianic title among God's people. If Jesus is the Messiah, then he must come from the royal line of David. In 2 Samuel 7:5-16, one of the most important passages in the Bible, God told David that one of his descendants will have an eternal kingdom "I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever . . . Your house and your kingdom will endure forever before me; your throne will be established forever" (2 Samuel 7:13,16). Jesus is the fulfillment of that promise, for the New Testament tells us repeatedly that Jesus is King of kings and Lord of Lords. After His death and

resurrection, Jesus ascended into heaven, where He now sits at the right hand of God, the place of honor, to rule the world forever.

This is why Matthew begins his Gospel with the genealogy of Jesus. This record provides the documentation that any Jew would want to see to verify Jesus' claim to be the Messiah. Matthew traces Jesus' family line back through Joseph all the way to David.

<u>Jesus is the Son of Abraham</u> (Matthew 1:1,17):

Matthew goes even further back than David, for Jesus is not only the "Son of David", he is also the "Son of Abraham". Abraham was the father of the Jewish people, the man God called to leave his native land of Ur and head west. In Genesis 12:1-3, God made three promises to Abraham. He promised to give him the land of Canaan; he promised to create a great nation from his descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky; and he promised to bless all nations of the world through him.

Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of God's promise to Abraham that "all peoples on earth will be blessed through you" (Genesis 12:3). As Paul makes clear in his letter to the Galatians, Jesus is the descendant of Abraham who brings blessing to all peoples. "Now the promises were spoken to Abraham and to his offspring... continued →

referring to one, And to your offspring, who is Christ" (Galatians 3:16).

And what is this universal blessing of Jesus? The provision of salvation from sin through the death and resurrection of the Messiah.

Jesus is God (Matthew 1:23):

Matthew 1:23 is a quotation of Isaiah 7:14 "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel which means "God with us." Jesus was God in a human body -- this is one of the foundational truths of biblical Christianity. When Jesus was born, God came to live among men by becoming a man. The element of mystery here is great, and this truth can be seen only with the eyes of faith. Unfortunately, the deity of Christ is a much-maligned doctrine; yet it is the clear teaching of Scripture.

Jesus is Savior (Matthew 1:21):

Why did the angel tell Joseph "you are to give him the name Jesus"? Because the name "Jesus" literally means "the Lord is salvation" or simply "Savior". And so Joseph gave him the name Jesus "because he will save his people from their sins." This, too, is a foundational truth of Christianity. Jesus was born to die, and through his sacrificial death he, and only he, is able to save us from our sins and their devastating consequences in both this life and the next. Those who receive this salvation by repenting of sin and embracing Christ as Savior and Lord know the joy of forgiveness and the hope of eternal life. We cannot help but sing praises to God for we love to testify that "the Father sent his Son to be the Savior of the world" (1 John 4:14).

Jesus is the Christ, Son of David and Son of Abraham, God and Savior. This is the true meaning of Christmas. And this is why we sing, "O come let us adore him, Christ the Lord."

Join us for Advent worship this year under the theme: "Symbols of Salvation" Our midweek Advent services will be on December 1st, 8th, and 15th at 6:30 PM. Our Christmas Choir Cantata will be at 9 AM on Sunday, December 19th. Christmas Eve worship will be on December 24th at 4:00 PM (children's program) and candlelight service at 6:30 PM. Christmas Day worship on December 25th will be at 9:00 AM. May the Lord bless your Advent and Christmas worship as we once again welcome Jesus into our hearts and lives.





Human Care

We're in the season of Advent, counting the days until Christmas. It's a festive season, but it can also be a stressful time. Tempers can run short.

Most of us have said things we wish we had not said. In the heat of the moment, our passion takes over and leaves our brains behind. One website posted an article in which people identified topics about which an argument ensued. These heated disagreements included:

- A discussion of which weighed more, a pound of bricks or a pound of feathers;
- A disagreement over who painted the Mona Lisa, one person saying the artist was Leonardo DiCaprio;
- An argument because of what someone did to the other in a dream;
- A brouhaha over the question of whether frosting turns a muffin into a cupcake;
- And a difference of opinion as to whether salsa and picante are the same thing.

Here's a reminder to help us as we engage with others during Advent. These principles are not original with me, and perhaps you've read them before. They bear repeating. Before saying something you might regret later, ask yourself three questions:


- Does this need to be said?
- Does this need to be said by me?
- Does this need to be said by me, now?

DID YOU KNOW..

Mark Allen Podoll was born at Berlin Hospital om April 29th 1961. His mother Helen was a stay-at-home-mom and babysitter for neighborhood children. Vernon, his father, worked at Berlin Foundry. Mark was welcomed into the family by one older brother. "Yes, I only have one brother, Gary. When you have the best, you don't need any more."

Vernon and Helen belonged to St John and brought their new little boy to our Baptismal font where he was Baptized by Pastor Arthur Schedler. Mark attended public school Kindergarten, then transferred to St John foe 1st through 8th grades. Here he played basketball under coach James Wudy, whose St John Badgers enjoyed many successful seasons during the mid-70's. Mark was Confirmed by Pastor David Meyer in 1976. His very first paying job was working on his Uncle's farm. "I vividly remember sitting at my Grandma's kitchen table when my Uncle Eric came in and paid me for a week's work on the farm. He gave me a whole dollar and I was so happy! I was rich!"

In the fall of 1976 Mark attended BHS and also began working nights and week-ends at Dale and Jim's Super Valu. (Where Second Time Around is now.) Mark graduated from BHS in 1980: then furthered his education at Fox Valley Tech graduating in 1982 with an

Associate degree in Criminal Justice. Further study in Basic Law Enforcement, Instructor Development, Tactical and Administrative classes was done through the National Sheriff's Academy.

in 1982 Mark began working for the Berlin Police Dept and in the 90's also worked parttime for Dretske Construction. In 1998, after a short stint with the Wild Rose PD, he began working for the Green Lake County Sheriff's Office. Mark was elected Green Lake County Sheriff in 2007 and has held that position for the past 14 years. The last 2 years have been difficult. "During this pandemic, it's been a challenge to keep the Sheriff's Dept running smoothly and giving people hope" What are his plans for the future? Mark hasn't decided yet. "My employees want me to run for another term. I am still praying about it." Mark continues to be active, serving as Vice president of the Badger State Sheriff's Assoc. in 2017-2018 and President in 2019-2020. Since 2010 he has also been a member of the National Sheriff's Assoc. serving on their **Education and Teaching Committee.**

Mark met Brenda Freimark here at church. They were married on November 29th 2008 by Pastor Bryan Lundquist. He has one daughter, Jordan, from a previous marriage and three step-children Greg, Chase and Bridget. He and Brenda also have 2 Grand kids: Lincoln and Brooks. For his entire life, Mark has been a member of our church. "I am very grateful to the members of St John who have always supported me in everything I do" He has served as Vice President and President of our congregation. (One of our youngest elected Presidents)

Mark has also been Chairman of the Board of Trustees, and a faithful usher whenever needed.

Today Mark and Brenda like taking trips with their family, spending time with their grandkids and bringing them to church. Mark is a Packer Fan, of course, and also follows the Brewers and Bucks, likes to watch Adam 12 and Emergency Squad 51 on TV and have lunch at Culvers. He also enjoys biking, cooking, grocery shopping, working in his yard and "Quiet time". (When I keep hoping my phone doesn't ring.) "I tell Brenda it's OK to do nothing. Quiet is beautiful!"


