This week we were reviewing how to write the numbers 8, 9, and 10. Our poem this week was "Mary Had a Little Lamb". We learned three more site words - of, in, & with. Help your child find these words in context as you read together.

MATH

We read a story called, "Five Little Ducks and More". We used ten frame cards and double sided disks to reproduce the actions of the story.

We used bathtub story cards with a ten frame on it, unifix cubes, a dice with the numbers 1-3 and a function die with plus and minus. We rolled the die to see if we would be adding or removing cubes from our cards.

We played a new board game called Pizza shop. We used double spinners. After we spun each, we added the numbers to see how many paces to move. Along the way we collected cheese and pepperoni chips to add to our pizzas.

We enjoyed our trip to the Police station. We were able to slide through the back of a police car and we received goodie bags to take home.

JESUS TIME

Sometimes we forget to trust in God and pray to Him when we have problems. Our powerful God cares for us and can rescue us from danger, even from sin, death, and the devil. In Bible, we watched the Joseph movie, and learned a little about how we can be the joy and light of the world.

In Math, 3rd grade worked on reviewing area and estimating that Area.
4th grade worked on fractions, and volume.

In Writing, we started researching a new topic for our next story! Reading Group 1 is reading Number of the Stars. Group 1 is working on being independent, and connecting their own experiences to that of Anne Marie in the story. Group 2 and Group 3 have started reading fiction stories and working on character development. In Whole group reading, we are reading fiction stories to discover different character traits and how they change throughout the story.

In Language, 3rd graders are working on adverbs again. 4th graders reviewed skills we have learned and took a test on Thursday. Friday we introduced the skill of predicate nominatives.

In Art, students learned about Claude Monet and impressionism. They worked on drawing their water lilies with oil pastels. In P.E. Students practiced for field day. In Computer, students are working on their PowerPoint presentation of their chosen historical figure.

In Social Studies, students learned about Theodore Roosevelt, Billy Sunday, and Laura Ingles Wilder. On Thursday, they took a test.






