Another great week!

In Math, students are reviewing concepts they should have seen previously in other grades. We practiced writing numbers, adding, subtracting, and writing fact families. Continue to encourage your children to take their time in math. It is so easy to try and rush through something, and not read the problem!

In Language Arts, we are still working on our stamina for Daily 5. Students learned a strategy to help them with comprehending while they read. They learned that good readers ask questions beginning, during, and after they read. We practiced making our own simple and strong questions. We read a book called Enemy Pie which helped them discover why we need to ask questions. We also got to do some cursive handwriting this week! They showed me what they knew and got to practice some basic cursive strokes. We also got to writing our first Personal Narrative draft and learned what the difference between a watermelon story and a seed story was.

In Bible, we learned about Cain and Abel and what it means to be a sinner. We also talked about the Tower of Babel and to keep ourselves humble. Then we talked about Abram and his story talking about trusting God in everything we do.

In Science, we learned about plants. We read about different types of flowers, and different types of seeds. Students even learned how seeds travel, and how they germinate. Monday we are going to dissect a lima bean and look for the embryo of the seed.

On Friday, we got to go to Heritage Hill and experience some interesting ways of living.
