What does November mean to you? Perhaps a beloved's birthday; maybe falling leaves, flying footballs, and a family feast. How about fallen veterans, Friday vacations, and flu shots? In America, the most obvious highlight in November is Thanksgiving Day. The seeds of this official holiday sprouted in 1789 with George Washington's Thanksgiving Proclamation. The original manuscript sold at auction at Christie's in New York for about \$12 million. While some well-to-do collector saw great value in this historic document, President Washington saw great value in the need to thank God for His blessings!

I once heard someone on the radio say there are no examples in the Bible of people thanking one another. This is not meant to encourage discourtesy. We all know how it feels to do something for someone -- letting a driver in ahead of you, or giving someone a present -- and not be acknowledged. If we're really sensitive, we get insulted by the disconnected thanks from the clerk who mechanically mumbles, "Thanks have a good one" or the child on the phone whose mom can be heard in the background saying, "Tell Auntie Em 'Thank you' for the nice sweater!" We all like to receive sincere expressions of appreciation. A giver deserves gratitude.

Bart Simpson once prayed, "Dear God. We paid for all this stuff ourselves, so thanks for nothing." What this profane painted personality fails to see is that God deserves thanks, not just for our food but absolutely everything! Let's add it all up: **"You shall remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth"** (Deuteronomy 8:18). **"You cause the grass to grow for the livestock and plants for man to cultivate, that he may bring forth food from the earth"** (Psalm 104:14).

The apostle Paul used an agricultural analogy to illustrate the work of the gospel: **"I planted,**

Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth" (1 Corinthians 3:6 - 7). Man can work as hard as he can, but if God doesn't bring results, the work is in vain. **"Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change"** (James 1:17, NRSV). Even the act of giving is energized by God. **"What do you have that you did not receive? If then you received it, why do you boast as if you did not receive it?"** (1 Corinthians 4:7). **"In him we live and move and have our being"** (Acts 17:28).

In light of the goodness of the Father of lights, this is how we should live: **"Giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ"** (Ephesians 5:20). **"And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him"** (Colossians 3:17). Although we may not understand what is going on in and around us, we can be thankful that God is a loving Father.

Notice that the thankful posture is linked to a standing in Jesus Christ. Speaking of those Christians who were motivated to give generously to the poor, Paul cries, **"Thanks be to God for his inexpressible gift!"** (2 Corinthians 9:15). Better by far than the Corinthians' generosity was the grace of God wrapped in the gift of salvation through the Son of God. And that's ultimately what we give thanks for -- not just at Thanksgiving, but every day of our life!

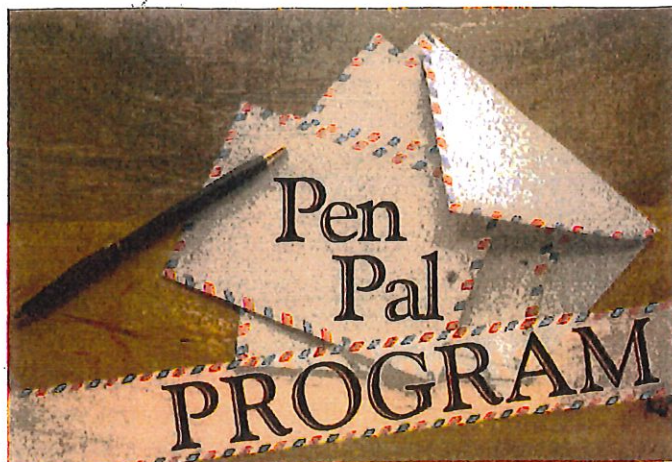

St. John Lutheran School students would like to become pen pals with the members of the St. John Lutheran congregation.

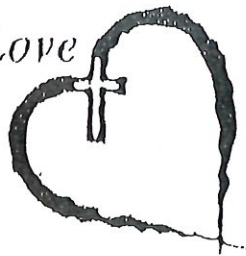

We live in an Age of Evaluation. It's all about ratings today.

Just about every commercial enterprise is subject to a "rating reaction." The obvious ones are restaurants, movies, hotels and books. But you can also review cars, airlines, colleges, stores and more.

When I look at ratings, I am most interested in the one-star ratings. These evaluations usually tell me more about the person offering the low rating than it tells me about what is being reviewed.

Consider the following 1-star ratings for some of our national parks:

- Grand Canyon National Park: "More like 'Mediocre Canyon'."
- Badlands National Park: "You lose cell service because you're in NOWHERE USA!" Really? You're surprised that in about 400 square miles of "badlands" you can't get a signal?
- Death Valley National Park: "I have to say, this is the ugliest park I have ever seen."
- Cuyahoga Valley National Park: "This is not a true national park." Like, what is a "true" national park?
- At Carlsbad Caverns National Park, there is only one thing to see: an epic cave. So that makes this comment interesting: "Unless you find caves and rocks overwhelmingly fascinating, skip this." So why one would travel to southeastern New Mexico? You didn't know that a place called Carlsbad Cavern wasn't about a ginormous cave?

We can laugh. It's okay. But, then let's remember that people who have no trouble giving the Grand Canyon National Park a 1-star rating *are also evaluating us!*

That's right. People are watching us, rating us, every day. Especially if we have made it known that we are God-loving, Jesus-following Christians.

The general public, including our friends and family, our neighbors and colleagues, roommates and tablemates in the dining room - knows if we're living up to the hype. They have opinions as to whether our actions are living up to our words.

Of course, we can't meet everyone's expectations. But it is helpful to remember that the eyes of others are on us.

Prayer: O God, help my actions to match my words today. In Jesus' name. Amen.

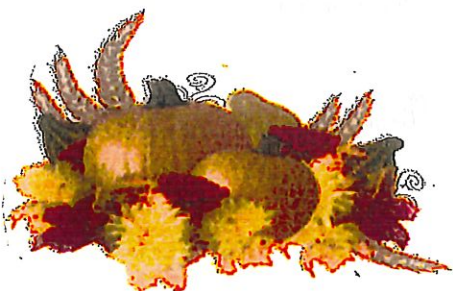

Attended Kindergarten at Washington School: St John for 1st through the 8th grade and was Confirmed by Pastor Arthur Schedler in 1960. Any guesses yet?

OK, here's another clue. As a young girl, she belonged to the Brownies, later Girl Scouts and remained active in the organization for many years. She attended Berlin High School and graduated in 1964. Nothing yet!!?

OK, one more clue: She met her future husband at the Poy Sippi Bowling Alley. On their first date they went to the Campus Theater, in Ripon, to see the movie Bambi and in June of 1965 they were married at our church by Pastor Schedler.

How about one more big clue? She grew up with 4 brothers and sisters: Sharon, Dennis, Wendy and Bill and her parents were Marvin and Norma Brooks. That's right folks!! She is Bonnie Lou Brooks Nehring!! Bonnie's

Motion by Linse/Mosier to adjourn. Meeting adjourned at 6:44 pm. Meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer

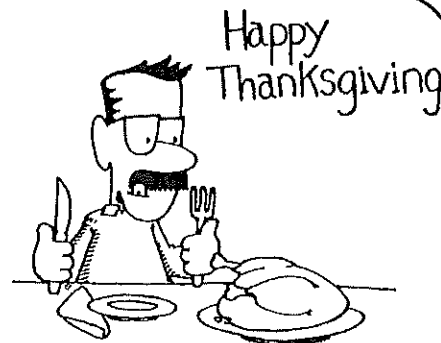

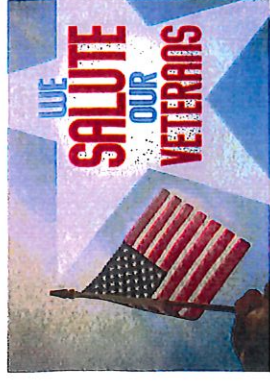
