Happy Friday!! Wow, another busy week for us in 4K. We had a ton of fun practicing for our Christmas Program as well. We love all the singing and dancing. The children also continue to work hard on all the decorations for our Thanksgiving Feast next week. They are so excited to share with

all their family. In math we continue to talk about our AABB pattern. We practiced making our own pattern using our plastic shapes. It went like this, square, square, triangle, triangle. The more we see this and are exposed to it, the easier it is for us to recognize. We also looked at shapes and graphed them in categories of 3 corners or 4 corners. During this activity we realized that only triangles can go in the 3 corners category but squares and rectangles can go in the 4 corners category.

In Jesus time we talked about the Israelites in the desert. It was hot and the people complained to Moses about the lack of food and water, but God provided for them. In the morning, there was mana, and in the evening, he sent quail for them to catch and eat. When they needed water, he told Moses to raise his stick and crack it over a rock. Water came. Moses prayed to God, and he provided. In literacy we read the nursery rhyme "Little Boy Blue" and searched for the letters J, P, and Z. The children are becoming guite the experts at recognizing and searching for letters within these rhymes. We are looking forward to an extended weekend coming up next week. The Live Nativity is around the corner and I will be needing some help with a few things. We will need help putting up the set at 10am the morning of December 3rd.


