What a busy week we had in 4K!! We ended this week with Grandparent's Day and had so much fun sharing our day with our special guests. We LOVED preforming the mitten for them as well.

In math we switched to a new unit as we entered the month of February. We made our new calendar pieces which involved bears and hearts. The children can not wait to see what our pattern will be this month. Will we continue the ABB pattern, or will it be a new one altogether? We also used our counting bears on our forest mats to tell simple story problems. Our spinners helped us pick the numbers of bears we were adding in each problem. It has been a cold week, but we have been able to get back to the schedule. Only 6 more weeks until it is spring officially. We were able to get a lot done this week and look forward to next week. We will be discussing the prophet Elijah and Elisha and talking about Naboth's vineyard. Both fifth and sixth graders will be taking Math test 12 on Tuesday. We will then explore the topics: prime factorization, dividing mixed numbers, naming decimal numbers, and writing tenths and hundredths as decimal numbers.
