



Welcome to August. You will soon see the teachers hard at work gearing up for the new school year. School enrollment numbers are being finalized. Our new classroom is ready. Classrooms are being setup. Final school cleaning is underway. We are very grateful to the trustees and the countless volunteers for their hard work this summer.

Thank you to everyone that helped move desks, chairs, whiteboards, a teacher desk, and lockers that were purchased for our school from All Saints. These projects would not be possible without our trustees and our wonderful volunteers.

We were able to use the rest of our EANS funds to purchase more student laptops and cover the cost of our CurriculumTrak, which we use to show that our curriculum aligns with state standards.

The Board of Education has selected a new standardized testing system to replace the IOWAs that our students have taken in the past. This new standardized testing system is more current and is done on a computer instead of with pencil and paper.

Our students held 2 lemonade stands this summer and were able to raise about \$800.00 to help with the cost of busing for school field trips.

Our Vacation Bible School was held on Saturday, July 22. Thank you to Kelli, Kayla, and Pastor for organizing and running this fun adventure for the students. Thank you to the countless volunteers who helped make the day a success for the children that attended.





Last week, I was cleaning through my files and I found this illustration on a 4-by-6 card that was in a sermon folder for 1 Corinthians. I don't know the source, but the content is the definition of anatomy an explanation of how our bodies work-and it is obviously written by a very young boy.

- "Your head is kind of round and hard and your brains are in it.
- "Your face is in the front of your head and where you eat and make faces.
- "Your neck is what keeps your head out of your collar. It is hard to keep clean.
- "Your stomach is something that if you don't eat enough it hurts, and spinach don't help
- none.
- "Your spine is a long bone in your back that keeps you from folding up.
- "Your back is always behind you no matter how quick you turn around.
- "Your arms you have to pitch with them and so you can reach the butter.
- "Your fingers stick out of your hand so that you can throw a curveball and add arithmetic.
- "Your legs is what if you have not got two of you can't get to first base.
- "Your feet are what you run on, your toes are what are always get stabbed and that is all there is to you except what's inside and I never saw that."

That's the perspective of a child. But the truth is that our bodies are amazing in conception, design and function. The psalmist David exclaimed, "I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made" (Psalm 139: 14).

We can praise God for giving us bodies which we inhabit in order to give praise to his holy name!

Prayer: Lord, my body is a wonderful thing, to be sure. But it is old and creaking. It doesn't have the energy it used to have. Its "get-up-and-go" has "got-up-and-gone." But like the psalmist, I will still praise You all of my days for Your steadfast lovingkindness. Amen.

# The 40<sup>th</sup> biennial LWML Convention was held June 22-25 with the theme "Celebrate the LORD of the Nations."

Leitha Kraus, Cindy Schuett, and Bonnie Sperberg attended this inspiring national convention which opened and closed with worship. Business was conducted, missionaries shared their testimonies, Bible study enriched us, we were encouraged to be "Esthers" for this day and age, LaVernne and Shirley kept us in stitches, the exhibit hall offered information and shopping, and "The Lutheran Ladies Lounge" entertained us. It was a mountaintop experience!

Here are some statistics: 3,550 registrants; 375 host committee volunteers; 1,200 servant event participants; 566 school kits assembled and 50,000+ meals packed for Orphan Grain Train; 162 fleece blankets tied; 1,167 Braille books and calendars assembled for Lutheran Braille Workers; 4,751 witness bracelets made for MOST Ministries; 1,154 cards of encouragement written; 125 golfers raised \$35,000 towards the new mission goal of \$2,350,000; 5 officers elected and 31 Mission Grants selected.

Gifts From the Heart (ingathering) recipients were truly blessed. Phil's Friends received 2293 puzzle books, 1268 journals, 1576 decks of cards, 1097 pair of fuzzy socks, 2545 hats, 95 hygiene items, 1240 note cards, plus \$16,296 in gift cards and cash. A Place of Refuge received 90 cases of hygiene and children's items, plus \$26,793 in gift cards and cash. (St. John contributed \$675 in gift cards.) MOST Ministries received 10,510 pair of eyeglasses, 7051 eye glass cases, plus \$75 in cash. Orphan Grain Train received 2078 quilts/blankets, 1786 hygiene kits, 24 school kits, 7 layette kits, 28 lap robes, plus \$25 in cash.

There were 4 convention offerings, and over 1,000 women walked for mites in downtown Milwaukee. Totals raised are still being tallied. Never underestimate the power of the Mighty Mite! \$28.9 million has been raised since 1942 benefiting 83 countries.




