Next week will be a full week again, so students will have spelling words and memory work like normal. The end of the quarter will be next Friday, so I have been reminding the students that they need to continue to work hard and finish the quarter strong. 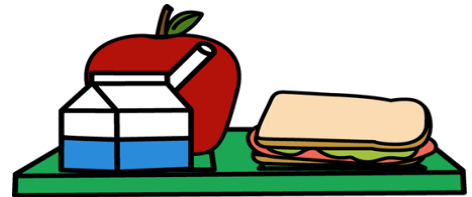
