All right, burger night!

Lean and tasty, these two dishes will liven up your family's next burger night.

Chicken and zucchini. In a large bowl, combine 1 lb. lean ground chicken with 1 beaten egg, 1 shredded zucchini, 1 minced garlic clove, ½ cup wholewheat breadcrumbs, and ¼ tsp. each salt and pepper. Divide into 4 patties, and sauté in an oiled skillet over medium-high heat until cooked through, about 3 minutes per side. Serve on whole-wheat buns with lettuce and tomato.

Quinoa and feta. Preheat oven to 400°. Beat 3 eggs in a large bowl. Stir in 2 cups cooked quinoa, 1 tbsp. tomato paste, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup whole-wheat panko breadcrumbs, $\frac{1}{4}$ cup crumbled feta cheese, 2 tbsp. parsley, and $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt. Arrange 4

patties on a lightly
greased baking sheet
and cook 20 minutes,
flipping halfway
through. Tuck into
whole-wheat pita
pockets with baby
spinach and nonfat
Greek yogurt.


