During Jesus time, we read the story of Jesus healing the 10 lepers. We then started unit 8 which covers the events of Holy Week leading to Easter. In math we have completed 93 lessons. The Supernoodle or boss would get to sit in a special chair and wear a special belt also. Cass got to be the first boss. We got new word bag words today. In first grade we are working hard in unit 7. We made covered wagons in Wisconsin History, talking about the pioneers that moved into our state. They helped Wisconsin become the 30th state in 1848.

Another week is done! We have one more full week, and then spring break. It will also be the end of the third quarter on the 21st, which I have been reminding the students in class to make sure they are turning in quality work for their grades to end the quarter strong. Report cards will be going home the week after break.

We will have a normal week with spelling and memory work. Students also have a math extra credit packet that they can work on and turn in by Friday. This will give them extra practice on skills we have been working on, as well as give them a chance to get extra credit for their grade. Check in with your child to see if they will be taking advantage of this. We will be working on complex sentences and adding s and es to the end of words for spelling. In religion we are learning about Hezekiah becoming the king of Judah at 25 years old and his trouble with the Assyrians. In reading, students have been enjoying their first literature circle. Each day they have a job sheet to complete, they share it and discuss it with their group and then they get to read together. I have been hearing some great conversations as I listen in each day! Just a reminder that the

Well, another week closer to spring break. We are studying about Russia in Geography and still talking about albino sauirrels in Science. We will be planning a dinner party menu in Math next week to work on conversion of fractions and costs for the menu items.

### JUST A REMINDER FROM THE PARENT HANDBOOK

Students are expected to walk in a quiet line on the right side when traveling to or from classrooms. No running, pushing, or yelling will be tolerated.

# Playground Rules:

- A. Children are not to sit or climb on any barricades, fences, bushes, or trees.
- B. Students are to be on the assigned playground areas only.
- C. Rough play or action in which someone could be injured is not allowed.
- D. Bikes are not to be ridden on sidewalks or on playground areas. Students are not allowed to play on or near parked bikes.
- E. There is to be no snowball or rock throwing.
- F. No sliding on sidewalks or walkways.
- G. Playground equipment can be dangerous if misused. Jumping from equipment and overloading equipment would be considered a misuse of that equipment.

- I. Students should receive permission from supervising teacher to retrieve any item that has left the designated play area.
- J. No home toys should be used at recess, only school provided items


