As We Gather... Many Old Testament Readings are full of what God demands that someone should or should not do; it sounds almost scary. But it is only His putting us in our place and telling us how He wants to work through us and share His love, already poured out on us: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Leviticus 19:18). But we try to limit the definition of "neighbor." We don't have to! Today we thank God for giving us, for Jesus' sake, "the inheritance of the saints in light," as Paul writes in the Epistle (Colossians 1:12). It is time to set aside our daily activities to let God put us in our place as His friends, followers, and family.

-Even though what Jesus asked them to do was incredibly difficult, they left behind their way of life and followed him.

-Like those four men, you've ______ Jesus before.
-Has your encounter with Jesus affected your life?
-"Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but the one who does the _____ of my Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 7:21)

-Jesus can and will change us – and he does it the same way, with a

-"I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." (John 21:32)

-In his ______, Jesus called all people to follow him. -Just like Jesus called Peter and Andrew, James and John to follow him; through the cross, Jesus calls each one of us to follow him.

-We're not all called to leave behind our possessions, hobbies, and lifestyles, but we are all called to leave behind having and doing those things simply for our own enjoyment.

-We're called to follow Jesus – to put _____ first and do with our lives what Jesus did with his.

-It's not enough to just know of Jesus and go about your business as usual. Instead, you've been called by Jesus through the cross to give up living a dead-end life for yourself, follow him, and take up living a full, hope-filled life for him.
