

-The promise of the kingdom of heaven and inheriting the earth for the poor in spirit and the meek is not an empty promise. -It's a promise that, true God, earned for us by becoming poor in spirit and meek himself! -Jesus loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood and made us a kingdom" (Revelation 1:5-6)
-Come to Jesus humbly, recognizing that you are unable, come to him begging, poor in spirit, meek, and receive from him — only him — the greatest of all: everlasting life in the paradise of the kingdom of heaven!
