

(Matthew 4:23) -"If we're going to tell people the Good News, we've got to be Good News people." -As those who follow Jesus in fishing for people, we also need to be "healing every disease and every affliction." -There are many problems in the world, and Jesus died and rose to ultimately fix them all. If we want people to listen as we tell them that Good News, it helps to bring them now by beginning to fix some of their problems We can heal others because, in his death and resurrection, Jesus has ultimately healed us.
-It's Jesus' and empty tomb that inspires and enables us to do everything that we talked about today. -These three practices work. -And as we follow Jesus and do what he did, he'll still be working to bring many more people to him.
