

Taking all of that together, that means we're also sent by the cross. -Jesus' cross sends you on his mission of showing and telling others so that they may also be saved. -"Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you rather than to God, you must judge, for we cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard." (Acts 4:19-20) -You have been _____ for mission. -I want to share some practical considerations about how to actually do this. -I can't cover everything. To be on the mission you've been sent for, you've got to continue to _____ God where he'll be equipping you. ____ is a great place to start mission – it often opens the door to being able to tell someone about Jesus. -1. What do you have that can help people?

-2. Who are some people you can use those gifts to help?

- -3. Pray and ask God for opportunities to share the Gospel with them.

Resources For Mission

For the last five weeks we have talked all about mission. There's nothing more important that we could be doing – in fact we were made for mission! And there is no greater need than for people to hear about Jesus Christ – he is the only way to be saved. Understanding this, I've tried to teach you the message for mission and where to go for God to continue to equip you for mission because YOU'VE BEEN SENT FOR MISSION! But there's only so much that can be done in a 5-week sermon series; you'll have to continue to learn and grow on your own – but I want to

help you to do that. Here are some resources that might be helpful for you.

- -**The Bible** (especially the New Testament) is a great tool. Read it with a mission focus and see how God wants you to be on mission and learn from Jesus and the apostles.
- -**Prayer** is another wonderful tool; no matter how well prepared you are, you'll never be good enough on your own but God will help. Ask him for that help.
- -**Practice** is an important component. Just like anything else in life, evangelism takes practice. The more you intentionally do it, and the more you learn from your mistakes, the better you'll get at it.
- -Joining Jesus on His Mission by Greg Fink is a book I would highly recommend reading. We have several copies in our church library.
- -Here are some other resources that I have not used personally, but that have been recommended:
