I hope everyone had a wonderful holiday weekend. We were very excited to see each other after the break. Your child brought home their G door page today. This is not required but can be fun. We are practicing numbers 0-20. We are also learning about the different types of pattern blocks in math. In language we are continuing to work on letter sounds and recognizing the beginning and ending sounds in words. We are also working on identifying if two words rhyme or not. We use nursery rhymes to go on letter hunts to practice recognizing capital and lowercase letters within words.

This week, during Jesus' time, we read about how after David became king, he kept his promise to take care of Jonathon's children. This story reminds us that God wants us to love others and treat them with kindness because God first loved us. We also read the story of when David's son Solomon became king and then was directed by God to build a permanent Tabernacle instead of the Israelites continuing to worship in the tent church that was constructed in the time of Moses. We continue to practice our handwriting. I have included some handwriting practice for the capital and lowercase L if you would like to work on that at

Thank you for your generous donations to our adopt-a-family child we were able to purchase warm pajamas, socks, clothes, diapers, wipes, and a fun educational little people farm toy (Black Friday deals are great). In Jesus time, we talked about Advent and how it is a special season when we get to celebrate Jesus. We talked about how each candle has a special meaning and that we will "light" a new candle each week on the advent wreaths we made as we get closer to Christmas. We talked about the hope, peace, joy, and love that Jesus brings.

We are on our 58th lesson in math and learning new concepts every day. In language arts, we finished with our eighth superkid friend, Icky and cannot wait to meet our new Superkid on Monday. We are working hard to sound out words made up or words we know.

We are also continuing to work hard on the Christmas program, and we are excited to perform for our parents. The Christmas program is on December 19th at 6pm at the Berlin High School auditorium. Our classroom's new snack prayer for December is "Lord, we thank you", to the tune of "Are You Sleeping?". It is a repeat after me prayer and the words are, "Lord, we thank you, (repeat) for our food, (repeat) and our many blessings, (repeat). A-a-men, (repeat)".

We have heard a lot about King Saul, David, Jonathan, and their relationship with God and each other. We have learned the 5th Commandment, Proverbs

5th Commandment, Proverbs 17:17 and Zechariah 7:9.

In math we have completed Lesson 60, learning about line segments, angles, and adding two-digit numbers. In Superkids, 2nd Grade has completed all the review work and are now reading *The* Superkids Hit Second Grade. The kids look a little different now that they are in second grade, just like we have changed. We are getting taller, our hair might be shorter, or a different style, and we are liking to write stories. Both grades are working with long vowel sounds, rhyming words, ch, tch, and sh sounds. We started adding 's, and using pronouns.

First grade is also learned ed and ing endings. They read Dominic's Apple. Second grade read Chapter 2. This month, we are writing sentences to go along with the word for the day on our calendar. So far our words have been: tradition, symbol, excited, sleigh, and holly!

It's hard to believe that we only have 2 weeks before Christmas break. This week we began preparing our hearts for the coming of our Savior by working on our Advent lapbook. This week we focused on the 1st candle which is the hope (prophecy) candle. This candle represents the HOPE of the prophets who foretold the birth of Jesus.

Next week we will be spending time learning how other countries around the world celebrate the birth of our Savior. Our first country we will travel to is Mexico. The Christmas "flower", the poinsettia, originated in Mexico. The legend is that a poor Mexican child wanted to give a gift to the Virgin Mary, but he had nothing to give. The child picked some weeds and laid them at the foot of the statue. Miraculously, they turned into beautiful, star-shaped flowers with the color of fire and light.

Christmas practice has kept us very busy! We have still been working hard in Math and Reading.

We have really been hitting multiplication hard. We're starting multiplication by two-digit numbers. Please practice these facts at home with your child! Math has a tendency to get harder and harder, so if the first piece of the puzzle isn't mastered, it's difficult to build on to the next concept.

In Reading we continue to work on using our new vocabulary words correctly in sentences with capital letters and punctuation. Our story this week was about a family who adopted a screech owl as a pet.

We are participating in the AR Challenge again this year in January. Please encourage your child to read as much as possible. You might even get a chance for them to check out new books at the public library.

Our first week of December is complete! I hope everyone had a relaxing Thanksgiving Break. We will continue to keep moving right along in our subjects. We discussed common, proper, concrete and abstract nouns in grammar. We made it through lesson 50 and took a math test today. We discussed the tabernacle in religion and are still working on the commandments and their meanings for memory. We focused on a nonfiction story about the endangered Florida panthers in reading and worked on sequence of events and cause and effect text structures. We are still working hard on preparing for the Christmas Program that we have on December 19th. I keep reminding the

students that they need proper gear for outside recess so that they can do things besides hanging out on the blacktop. Boots, snowpants, jackets, hats and gloves are highly encouraged. Have a great weekend!

Thank you, Mr. Snow, for filling in this week for me while I was away. This week the students continued to read A Christmas Carol. In Language Arts, the seventh grade has been working on reviewing concepts they learned in the past and now they get to move on to learning the different parts of speech. The eighth graders have also been reviewing concepts they learned earlier in the year. In Science, we have started a new unit where we are using dog sled races in Alaska to learn about how precipitation, temperature, and latitude can affect climate. In History, they started learning about the Articles of Confederation and the transition to the Constitution as we know it today. In Confirmation, they continued learning about Apostles' Creed. Please continue to monitor the weather to make sure your student is prepared for recess.
