Oh what a FUN and exciting week we have had. Thank you to the PTL for the coffee and lunch this week. Thank you to the congregation of St. John Lutheran Church for supporting our school.

All students in grades 1-8 are competing with other Lutheran Schools across the country in the Accelerated Reading (AR) Challenge which started on MONDAY. Each week we will report our scores. Students earn points by reading books and taking AR tests on them. The Preschool and Kindergarten students are participating in the Wisconsin Timber Rattler's reading program to earn a ticket for a baseball game.
