AS WE GATHER... Every year, the Epiphany of Our Lord is announced by the coming of the Magi from the East (on January 6) and the Baptism of Our Lord on the following Sunday. Likewise, every year on the next Sunday, John summarizes the significance of what we will hear concerning the earthly ministry of Jesus leading to the glory of His cross. Jesus enacts His first sign or miracle at a wedding in Cana. Turning water into wine signifies more than the joy of the marriage of God to His people. To Christians, it instantly calls to mind the Means by which God literally pours the new life of forgiveness into us through the blood of the cross of Christ. As the Bride of Christ, the Holy Church is empowered by the Holy Spirit to live a life of the reverent worship of God and loving service of one another and the world. The one Spirit works through the many members of the Body of Christ.

-Revenge and retaliation come _____ for us; that’s our first instinct when we’re wronged.

-“But I say to you, Do not _____ the one who is evil.” (Matthew 5:39)

-“If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also.” (Matthew 5:39)

-“And if anyone would sue you and take your tunic, let him have your cloak as well.” (Matthew 5:40)

-“And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him _____ miles.” (Matthew 5:41)

-The reality is that by our continual sinning, we’ve _____ God so much more than we’ll ever be hurt by anyone else.

-“He committed no sin...When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten...He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree.” (1 Peter 2:22-24)

-_____ perfectly lived each of the examples he told to us.

-I understand that Jesus’ teaching sounds ridiculous and probably impossible, and for us alone, it would be! But Jesus gives us the _____ to look to. He led by example. And trusting what he did for us sinners fills us with enough love to not only not retaliate but to even submit to those who hurt us.

-It’s important that we do it – acting like this changes lives, it changes eternal lives!

-Jesus taught us to not retaliate but to submit to further pain from those who hurt us. By going to the cross to pay for our sins, Jesus is the perfect example of this teaching. _____ by Jesus' example, we can _____ this radical teaching even though it's hard. And through our obedience, people will catch a glimpse of Jesus.
