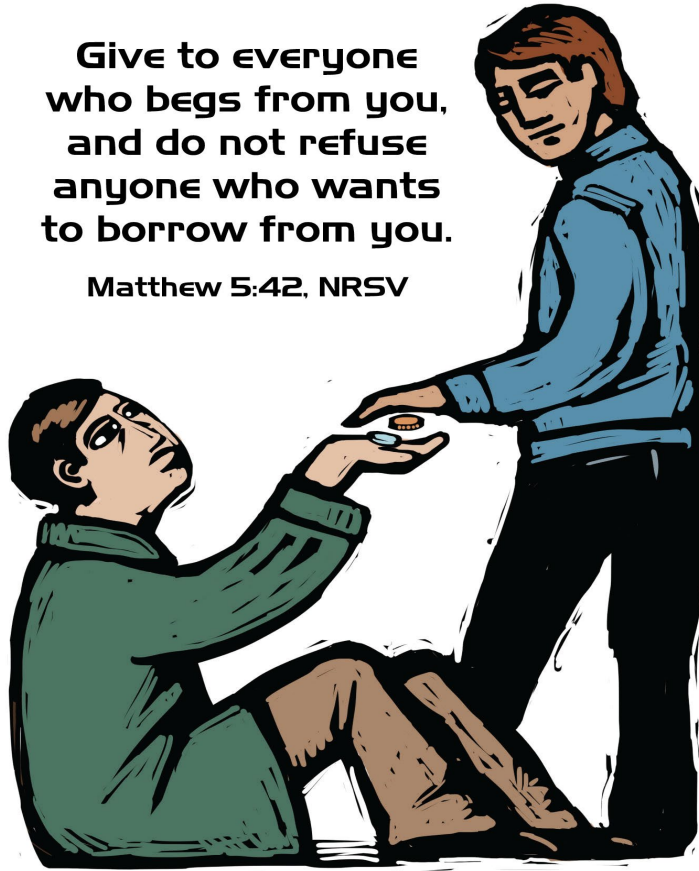

AS WE GATHER... The Epiphany season proclaims and celebrates the salvation of God coming into the world as a light shining in a dark place. Matthew quotes the prophet Isaiah predicting the dawning of that light into the darkness of unbelief, separation from God, sin, and "the shadow of death" (Matthew 4:16). That light was and is Jesus and His message: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (v. 17). It may seem like a minor detail that Matthew says Isaiah's prophetic words were fulfilled when Jesus left His hometown of Nazareth to live "in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali" (v. 13). Yet even this little fact testifies to how real the words of the Old Testament are and how they are fulfilled in Jesus, the Christ.

Sermon Notes – 1-25-26 – Taken Advantage Of

-“_____ to the one who begs from you, and do not refuse the one who would borrow from you.” (Matthew 5:42)

-The vast majority of even the most generous people I know stop far short of following Jesus’ very clear command.

-“Jesus’ words should _____ our instincts, our quick reactions, our unwillingness to sacrifice.”

-Jesus is instructing us to allow ourselves to be taken advantage of.

-Instead of ignoring it, we should let Jesus’ words _____ us. He’s God, and we’re not; we should submit to him.

-Jesus gives us another really good reason to listen to him: He led by example. He was taken advantage of to benefit us and to _____ us to follow even this difficult command.

-When we “beg” forgiveness, life, and love from God, he should look at us and say, “No, you don’t deserve that.”

-In order to give us his forgiveness, Jesus _____ everything; he paid the ultimate price – he gave his life!

-When you realize what you have because of Jesus’ generosity, it frees you from clinging so tightly to your wealth.

-“The only limit to the believer’s response in these situations is what the Scriptures and _____ impose.”

-“If Jesus’ disciples will err, let it be on the side of being taken advantage of.”

-“Although an enlightened conscience must decide how to serve the other, love has already decided that one must _____.”

-Giving doesn't have to be financial. You can give time, effort, or wisdom.

-Ask yourself not, “What's best for me?” But rather, “What's _____ for my neighbor?” And whatever is best, if you are truly able, give.
