AS WE GATHER... In the stewardship hymn "Forgive Us, Lord, for Shallow Thankfulness," author William Watkins Reid Sr. includes the thoughtful line "Forgive us, Lord, for feast that knows not fast" (*LSB* 788:5). The text, written in 1965, reflected a growing understanding of the need for service in Jesus' name by all who had received His blessing. In the concluding stanza of the hymn, he also writes, "May thankfulness be days in service spent, reflection of Christ's life and love and light." In this Epiphany season, when we celebrate the radiantly expanding light of Christ, we are directed to find new ways to reflect that light into all the areas of our life. Paul says it simply and directly: "So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone" (Galatians 6:10). Those opportunities are just waiting for us!

-Jesus confronts us.

-“For I tell you, unless your _____ exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.” (Matthew 5:20)

-All these words confront us. No one can honestly look at the things Jesus taught and think that they’re good enough, that they deserve God’s favor, that they merit heaven.

-If perfection is the standard, and Jesus says it is, then we’ve got no _____. We can’t be with God. We’re going to die and rot in hell forever.

-Jesus’ words also _____ us.

-“Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.” (Matthew 5:43-47)

-“For God so _____ the world (his enemies), that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.” (John 3:16)

-For all those sins that confronted you, you are forgiven.

-Jesus’ words also _____ us.

-We just saw that we have an incredible, forgiving, loving Father.

-Because he’s a perfect Father, we should _____ to please him.

-“Because I want to obey God; I don’t want to make him _____...because I know that he loves me.”
